MODEL EXAMPLE FOR ACTION PLAN

SAMPLE ACTION PLAN CATEGORY EXAMPLES

Planning

Create a plan to support the selection of interactive display devices based on instructional priorities, cost, management, and implementation of 1:1 devices at the elementary.

Budgeting

Design a budget for current devices and a sustainability plan for ongoing support of devices. Purchase devices for initial implementation.

Professional Development

Create an a continuous instructional coaching program to support teachers with in-classroom assistance while implementing the 1:1 device initiative.

Implementation

At the beginning of the 2023-24 school year, roll-out the 1:1 initiative in grades 3-5.

Evaluate the implementation of the 1:1 program on a weekly basis to make revisions as needed.


